

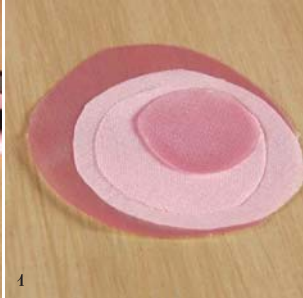
# Flower Headbands

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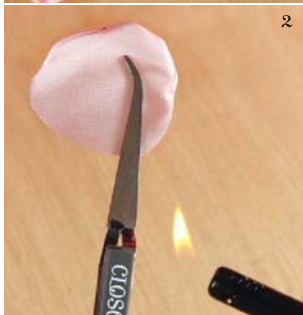




*Seal the edges  
of your flower  
petals with a  
clear glaze, or  
by heating them  
with a flame or  
embossing gun.*

Flowers are about 5 1/2" across  
Headband: Goody; Satin: Fabric supply; Felt,  
beads: Craft supply

1 Cut 4-6 concentric circles from satin,  
with the largest being about 5 1/2".

2 Using a hand-held lighter (or candle  
flame, or heat embossing gun), heat  
the edges of each circle until they melt  
slightly and curl.

3 Starting with the base (largest) circle,  
hot glue the circles together, large to  
small.

4 Glue rhinestones or beads to the center of the topmost flower.

5 Hot glue the flower to a headband.

*Glue a felt circle to the back of the base flower (either before or after gluing it to the headband) to give the flower more support.*
